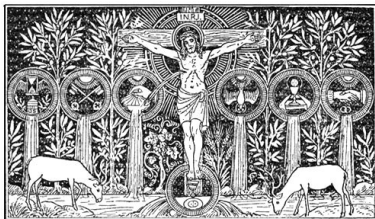

Sacrament of Baptism.

The sacrament through which God, in Jesus Christ, makes us His sons and daughters. To prepare for

reception, email Father Edison @ fr.edison.tayag@dor.org.

Sacrament of the Eucharist. The sacrament through which God, like a loving parent, feeds us, with food from heaven: His Word, and the Body and Blood of Jesus.

- **Weekend Masses:** Saturday at 4:30 PM, Sunday at 8:30 and 10:30 AM. **The Sunday 5 PM Mass will resume on September 11. Be faithful to the Sunday obligation.**
- Weekday Masses: Monday-Wednesday, Friday at 8:30 AM. Thursday at 8:30 AM: Communion Service.
- For First Holy Communion, call Donna DeJoode at 924-2800 for more info.
- Family members may bring Holy Communion to other family members who are sick and homebound.

Sacrament of Confirmation. The sacrament through which God by the gift of the Holy Spirit strengthens us to give faithful witness to our Catholic Faith. To prepare for reception, call Donna DeJoode @ 924-2800.

- Children, older than 7 y/o, and adults who needs to be baptized, receive Communion and/or be Confirmed, call Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of Reconciliation. The sacrament through which God's mercy and love, justice and truth heals the wound of human sin. *Generally offered an hour before each Mass.* Please give the priest fifteen minutes before Mass to prepare for Mass.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The sacrament through which Jesus continues to heal the sick among us. Anointing is offered at each Mass on the first weekend of the month. Or call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111 to schedule an anointing.

Sacrament of Marriage. The sacrament through which God calls a man and woman to become visible signs of His Love. Call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111 for more info.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. The sacrament through which the mission Jesus entrusted to the apostles is continued in the Church. To learn more about vocations to the ordained ministry, please call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Spiritual Exercise 4
Show your generosity.

Let us apply the lessons that we learned from the Parable of the Rich Fool (to be mindful of God and others and share

with them our blessings) and the Parable of the Faithful and Prudent Servant (to build the household of God through faithful service).

Firstly, let us recognize God's immense generosity to us. Everything that we are and everything that we have is from God. May this wonderful reality make our hearts always grateful. Remember to say, "Thank You!" to God every day.

Secondly, find simple ways to show our generosity. Here are two suggestions -

- Bring canned food for the Victor-Farmington Food Cupboard. These days, we all know how pricey grocery items have become. Any help that we can provide our brothers and sisters in need is much appreciated. We support our local food cupboard throughout the year and we have a collection bin by the Alcove to receive your donation.
- Or, consider bringing some items for the care packages that we will be sending to our children in college - post-it notes, highlighters, and individually packed snacks. Through these care packages, may our children feel connected to their parish. Remember, too, to include them in your daily prayers. Drop off items in the basket by the Baptismal font.

Thank you for going through these spiritual exercises. On the surface, the exercises are too simple. But when developed as habits, consistently done, these exercises can make us better and holier disciples.

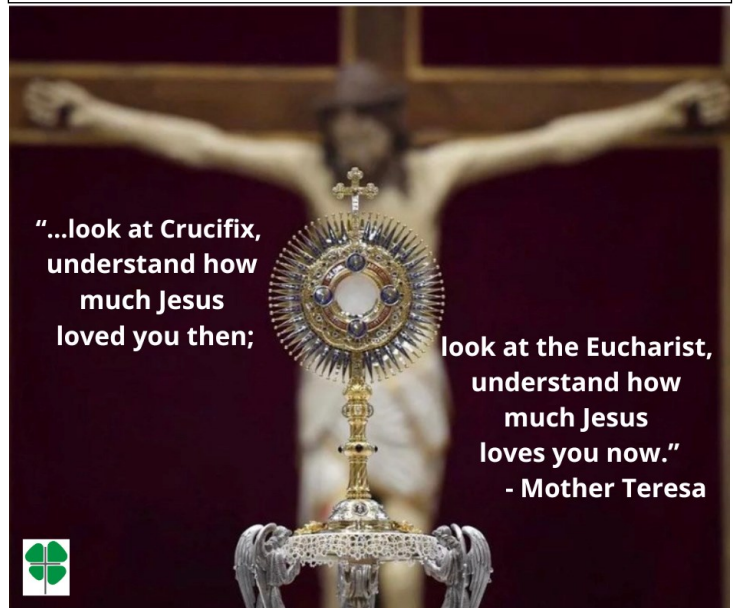
Daily 3 PM Prayer Intentions

In the Spirit of Accompaniment



Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come."

But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, "Truly, you are the Son of God." - Matthew 14:28-33

- Because of this incident on the Sea of Galilee, the boat has been adopted by early Christian as a symbol for the Church. To this day, one may find 1st cent AD carved graffiti of boats on rocks along the shores of Galilee. Try to make some connection between the make-up of a boat and the architecture of churches.

- When were times when you felt the Church has been tossed by waves and winds? Where did you find God's presence/accompaniment during these times?

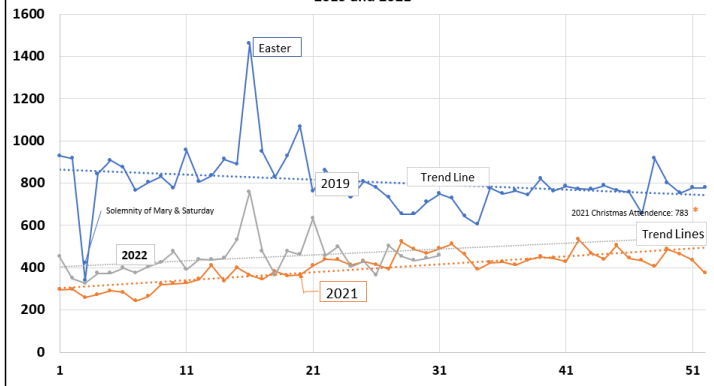
Assisi Ministry,

Let there be light...

Our Knowledge of Jesus and His Demands

Jesus said to his disciples:

*“Do not be afraid any longer, little flock,
for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom.*

Sell your belongings and give alms.

*Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out,
an inexhaustible treasure in heaven*

that no thief can reach nor moth destroy.

For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.

- Luke 12:32-34

Previously, through the Parable of the Rich Fool, Jesus made us aware that God knows the number of our earthly days. And now, He brings to our attention that God offers us something more than earthly - God is even pleased to give us His kingdom in heaven.

For the faithful, there is no reason to fear. Our earthly days are indeed numbered but God offers us eternity. None of our earthly belongings will make it heaven; so, we must focus on gathering heavenly treasures.

*“Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants
who await their master’s return from a wedding,
ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks.*

Blessed are those servants

whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival.

Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself,

have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them.

And should he come in the second or third watch

and find them prepared in this way,

blessed are those servants.

Be sure of this:

if the master of the house had known the hour

when the thief was coming,

he would not have let his house be broken into.

*You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect,
the Son of Man will come.”*

- Luke 12:35-40

Then, what must be our preoccupation during our earthly days?

We must see Jesus as our Master and ourselves as His servants. We must live our lives in relation to Jesus, who is away but will come back for us. We must live our lives like His servants - our preoccupation is to care for His household, to take care of each other, and to wait for His return.

Then Peter said,

“Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?”

And the Lord replied,

*“Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward
whom the master will put in charge of his servants
to distribute the food allowance at the proper time?*

Blessed is that servant whom his master on arrival finds doing so.

*Truly, I say to you, the master will put the servant
in charge of all his property.*

- Luke 12:41-43

The first part of Jesus’ reply focuses on who the faithful and prudent servant is - he is blessed! Why? Because he was clear about His master’s intent and his responsibilities, and kept them. He has proven himself trustworthy.

*But if that servant says to himself,
‘My master is delayed in coming,’
and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants,
to eat and drink and get drunk,
then that servant’s master will come
on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour
and will punish the servant severely
and assign him a place with the unfaithful.
That servant who knew his master’s will
but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will
shall be beaten severely;
and the servant who was ignorant of his master’s will
but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating
shall be beaten only lightly.
Much will be required of the person entrusted with much,
and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.”*

- Luke 12:44-48

The second part of His reply focuses on the foolish servant who ignored his Master’s intent and abused his responsibilities. Let his plight not be ours!

Is this merely for us or for everyone? For everyone! However, Christians will be judged more severely because of our knowledge of Jesus and His demands.
