



Sacrament of Baptism.

The sacrament through which God, in Jesus Christ, makes us His sons and daughters. To prepare for reception, email Father Edison @ fr.edison.tayag@dor.org.

Sacrament of the Eucharist.

The sacrament through which God, like a loving parent, feeds us, with food from heaven: His Word, and the Body and Blood of Jesus.

- Weekend Masses: Saturday at 4:30 PM, Sunday at 8:30 AM, and 10:30 AM. During the three-year Eucharistic Revival, let us deepen our love for Jesus in the Eucharist.
- Weekday Masses: Monday-Wednesday, Friday at 8:30 AM. Thursday at 8:30 AM: Communion Service.
- For First Holy Communion, call Donna DeJooode at 924-2800 for more info.
- Family members may bring Holy Communion to other family members who are sick and homebound. See Father Edison.

Sacrament of Confirmation.

The sacrament through which God by the gift of the Holy Spirit strengthens us to give faithful witness to our Catholic Faith. To prepare for reception, call Donna DeJooode @ 924-2800.

- Children, older than 7 y/o, and adults who needs to be baptized, receive Communion and/or be Confirmed, call Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The sacrament through which God's mercy and love, justice and truth heals the wound of human sin. Generally offered an hour before each Mass - daily and weekend. Please give the priest fifteen minutes before Mass to prepare for Mass.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

The sacrament through which Jesus continues to heal the sick among us. Anointing is offered at each Mass on the first weekend of the month, or call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of Marriage.

The sacrament through which God calls a man and woman to become visible signs of His and His People's love. For inquiries about marriage preparation, call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of Holy Orders.

The sacrament through which the mission Jesus entrusted to the apostles is continued in the Church. To learn more about vocations to the ordained ministry, please call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Spiritual Exercise 13: Be fishers of men and women

One of the first things that Jesus did during His public ministry was to call the Twelve in order to make them fishers of men and women. Jesus called many more to follow Him but the Twelve He particular chose to accompany Him and, therefore, were tasked the apostolic responsibility of overseeing the early Church after Jesus returned to God the Father.

This weekend, Jesus brings church growth to our attention. Church growth must be a recurring theme in our discipleship. Why? Because it is the mission of Jesus to gather all nations for God and this is the same mission He entrusted to us. The question is "How are we doing?"

In these recent decades, we need to acknowledge and address two related phenomena in the Church. These are the decline in participation at Sunday Mass and the decline in the number of men responding to the vocation to the ordained priesthood. These two are distinct but inseparable realities in Jesus Christ.

I believe that an important key to increasing our presence and participation at Sunday Mass is our recognition of Jesus as the Sacrifice - His Body is the Bread of Eternal Life. No other food on earth gives us divine life. And an important key to increasing the number of men responding to the vocation to the ordained priesthood is our acknowledgment of Jesus the High Priest - the Groom who loves and offers His life for His Bride, the Church.

What can we do?

- *Re-affirm our love Jesus the Sacrifice and the High Priest.* It is not to the personal benefit of Jesus that He is both Sacrifice and High Priest. Rather Jesus does these for us - it is us who benefits from Him being our life-giving food and unique mediator.
- *Pray for increase in vocations in the Church, particularly the ordained priesthood.* Through pray, we align our will to God's will.
- *Raise your sons to love Jesus and the Church.* Dads and moms, be witnesses of the love between Jesus and His Church to your children.
- *Host the traveling chalice and paten.* Through this simple activity, we bring home Jesus the Sacrifice and the High Priest to our homes. We have two sets, found in the cart by the Parish Office. Take a set and be a host for a week. Remember to check them out. See instructions that go with the sets.

The passport stamper is on the book cart by the Parish Office door.

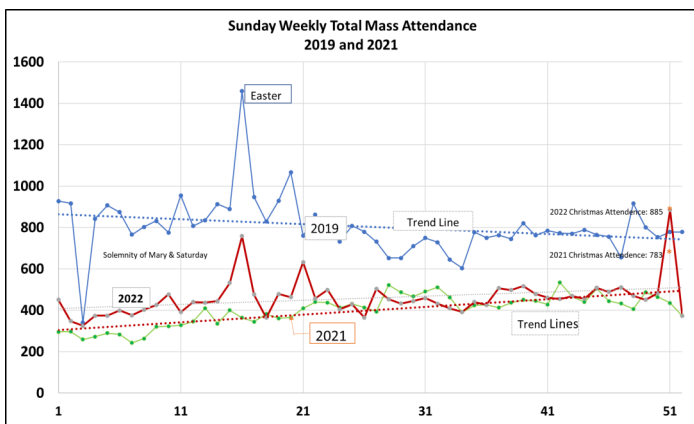
